Bilateral Breast Ultrasound/X-Ray Chest

Clinical History: Lump under right nipple. Also prominent area over right upper sternum/costochondral junction near the 3rd rib. History of RA.

Findings:

Bilateral Breast Ultrasound:

Normal but prominent retroareolar parenchymal tissue is noted (right greater than left). This corresponds to the area of clinical abnormality. Ultrasound appearance is most consistent with mildly asymmetric gynaecomastia. No discrete mass or abnormal vascularity is identified.

There is no axillary lymphadenopathy.

IMPRESSION:

Ultrasound findings are most consistent with bilateral gynaecomastia (right > left). No discrete mass is identified.

XRAY Chest:

PA and lateral study.

The cardiomedastinal contour is normal.

The lungs are well aerated and clear. No features of pulmonary oedema. No pleural effusion or pneumothorax.
